Be Sober and Alert

On Tuesday, September 5, 2017, the weekday reading for week 22 included the following:

1 Thessalonians 5:6-9 Therefore, let us not sleep as the rest do, but let us stay alert and sober. For God did not destine us for wrath, but to gain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep we may live together with him. **Therefore, encourage one another and build one another up, as indeed you do.**

That reminded me of another verse:

1 Peter 5:8 Be sober and vigilant. Your opponent the devil is prowling around like a roaring lion looking for [someone] to devour.

What in the world does this have to do with Cursillo, Fr. Joe? Well, let me try to explain. I truly believe the Cursillo movement is an inspiration of the Holy Spirit. I have found that many times when I am going to team, I have come under attack. All sorts of things from health issues to problems in the parish or my personal life come to the surface. In other words, when we are trying to do the Lord's work, we many times come under attack. So, we must be ever vigilant, because the evil is prowling looking for someone to devour.

He acts this way in our community. All of us want the best for our Cursillo community. All of us want to be a friend, and want to bring a friend to Christ. There are many ways to do that and many leadership styles to do that. Where we all have to be careful is how we see one another. How do we treat one another? St. Paul says that we should encourage one another, not criticize one another. I am sensing division in our community, and that can only come from one place. We are called to love one another and support one another. That doesn't mean that we always agree, but it does mean that any disagreement must be done in love. When we disagree what should we do? Scripture gives us the answer. We need to sit down with one another and work things through in love, with respect for one another's opinion. That takes courage, and that courage comes from the Holy Spirit. One of the things I always say to my staff is that we must be community or we cannot call others to community. How can we call others to our Cursillo family, if we are not in truth family – if we are not in truth united?

So that is the challenge. The devil is looking to divide us. We must be sober and alert. And as St. Paul says, encourage one another and build one another up. That is the challenge for our time. Let us all put aside all grievances and yes even past hurts. Let's make a new beginning. Let's talk to one another and share our desires and our hopes. Let's not give the devil any room to divide us, but let us all be centered on Christ and work together to bring many people to Christ and to make our community truly Christ centered. Our Cursillo community is made up of many wonderful faith filled people. I know we can make this work.

So, do we ever rely totally on the Holy Spirit or as someone recently said at a meeting, is it lip-service?

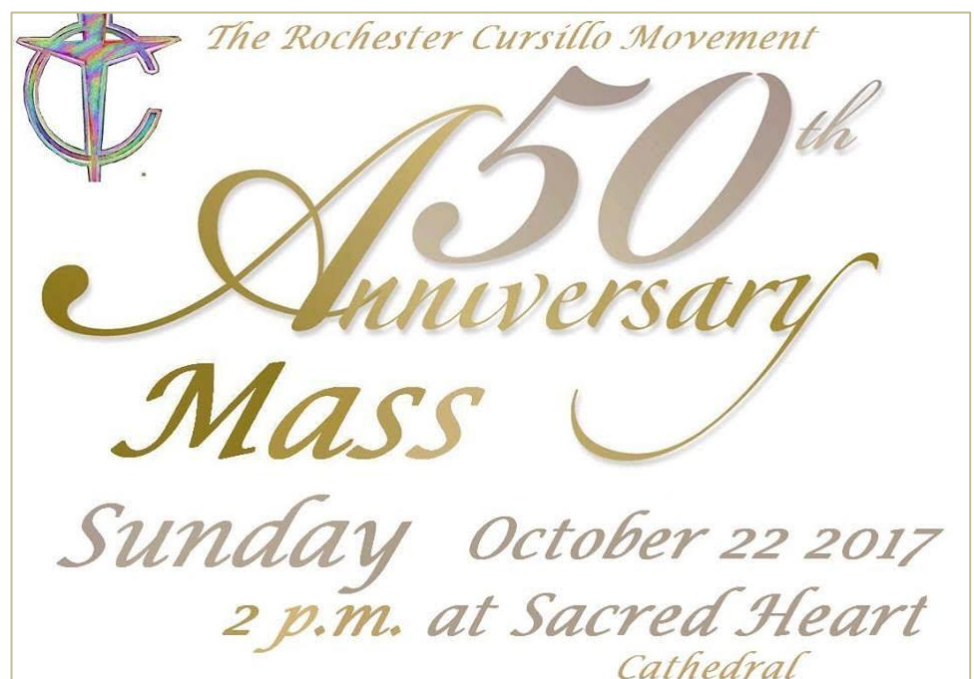

De Colores everyone. We hope that you all are doing well. We pray that the Woman's 87 candidates will receive a renewed spirituality and a clearer understanding of how Christ can work through them. Then these babe chicks can bring Christian values to all environments and to the people that they meet. We pray that Cursillo will become a way of thinking and a pattern for daily living while offering a Christian community of support in civic, social, parish, and economic life.

This month we would like to provide some information on the process of candidate selection and sponsor support. The proper selection, preparation, and support of Cursillo candidates before, during and after the 3-day weekend are extremely important. This is all done by the sponsor.

How should a sponsor begin this process? With prayer. Sponsors should always ask God to lead and guide them during this process.

Then a sponsor needs to seriously ask themselves "Am I ready to be 100% invested in this commitment?" You see, *the continual support and guidance by the sponsor is vital to the candidate.* Sponsors must prayerfully embrace all aspects of their role, and understand that they do not just ask a friend to attend the weekend. Think of the sponsorship role as a parallel to being a Godparent. Like a Godparent, the sponsor must support and guide their candidate before, during and after the weekend. We are all aware that the secular world is difficult to live in, and our babe chicks need help in the 4th day. We suggest that all sponsors should read, then read again, the blue Cursillo Movement Sponsor's Booklet.

Sponsors should make sure that their potential candidates are receptive and understands the Gospel message, is committed to loving God, is serving the community with good stewardship, can receive the sacraments, is capable in living in grace, and is open to progressive conversion. This can only be done if a sponsor knows their candidate very well and has truly used the motto "make a friend, be a friend, lead a friend to Christ." "Without this friendship, the proper discernment and support for the candidate is lacking. All sponsors should review with their candidates the pink Cursillo Movement; what is it? Again, your ultreya center has this book available for you.

We must tell you how wonderful it is to be a part of the Cursillo family. Thank you for letting us grow in love and faith of our Lord with you. Thank you for letting us serve on the Secretariat as your Pre-cursillo chairs for more than 5 years. It is time for us to step down now. Both of us will end our roles after the Woman's 87 weekend. We need to allow our Rochester Cursillo Movement to grow from a new set of Pre-cursillo leaders.
