Bishop Matano Declares Year of the Eucharist

Many of you may not know this, but on March 3, 2018 the Diocese of Rochester will celebrate the 150th anniversary of its establishment. In honor of this, Bishop Matano is declaring – beginning on the Sunday in which we celebrated The Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord - a “Year of the Eucharist” in our diocese. It is the bishop’s desire that we take more time and effort in parish life to understand and appreciate the inestimable gift of the Eucharist, which is, of course, nothing other than Jesus himself.

We all know what a great decline we have seen in our day in Sunday Mass attendance; and because of our love of Jesus in the Eucharist, it saddens our hearts to find ourselves in the midst of such a crisis. It is our hope, along with Bishop Matano, that this year may be a turning point for our diocese so that not only will people better understand how great a gift we have in the Eucharist, but also that, because of this knowledge, we will more eagerly desire to become missionary disciples and share our love of Jesus with others in the world.

For those in the Cursillo movement, this should be second nature, but even in our own movement we struggle to in the areas of both discipleship and being missionaries. It is the nature of the evil one to impinge upon us even more as we strive to draw closer to Christ. The Eucharist is a great weapon and defense against the wiles of the devil and his minions.

In his book, that is a modern classic, *The Lamb’s Supper*, Scott Hahn steps through the book of Revelations and points out its connection to the Mass and to the fact that the celebration of the sacred liturgy is itself a weapon against evil. This makes so much sense when we understand the nature of it. What is Mass other than the very sacrifice of Christ, re-presented to the Father. That is, it is the saving act of Jesus that wins for us our salvation.

As we say in the Preface of the Eucharistic Prayer (the consecration) in the Mass of the Lord’s Supper on Holy Thursday:

As we eat his flesh that was sacrificed for us,
we are made strong,
and, as we drink his Blood that was poured out for us,
we are washed clean.

We see, therefore, what a great weapon this must be against evil and all that seeks to divide us - as a movement, as a church, and as the people of God called to be missionary disciples. Let us redouble our efforts to serve the Lord and the diocese this year by being ever more faithful to the Eucharist and to its power to dispel all evil. May we offer as palanca as many holy communions for the good of others and the movement, so that we may all share in “times of refreshment” (Acts 3:20) and our local church (our diocese), our movement and our own hearts may be renewed and the glory of God may be more manifest in our times.

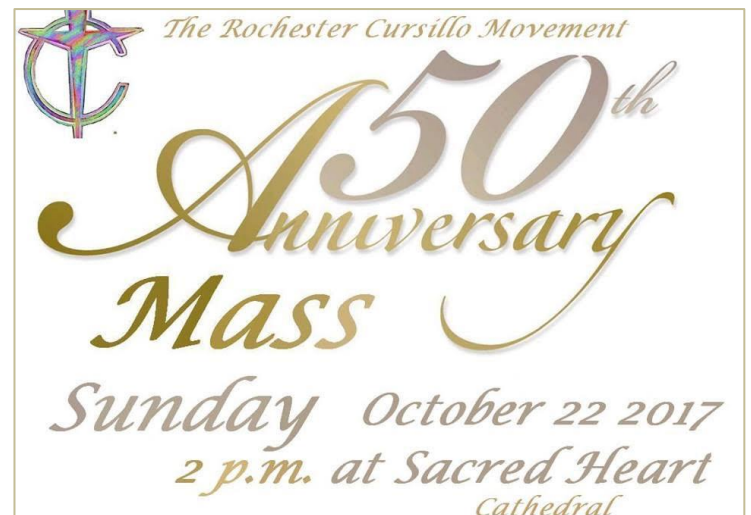
Post- Cursillo
