Spiritual Advisor Wisdom

Eucharist, Spiritual Communion and More - Oh My!

Has the pandemic made you feel like Dorothy in the Wizard of Oz who said, “Toto, I feel we are not in Kansas anymore?”

Because of the Covid-19 virus, we have not been able to attend Mass and receive Jesus in Holy Communion like we did before. As a result, we were blessed by attending virtual Mass from our living room and receiving Jesus in spiritual communion. Jesus has always been in spiritual communion with us, God’s holy people, long before the Corona virus.

Spiritual Communion has been a traditional practice of expressing to the Lord our longing for Him and our desire for Him to enter into our hearts by God’s holy people.

St. Teresa of Avila (1515-1582) said, “When you do not receive Communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a spiritual communion, which is a most beneficial practice; by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you.”

St. Jean-Marie Vianney (1786-1859) a priest from France said, “When we feel the love of God growing cold, let us instantly make a spiritual communion.”

Because Jesus loves us and wants a loving relationship, He provides many other ways to be with us. We may have forgotten Jesus’ own words, “For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them” (Mt 18:20).

Also, “We grow in union with Christ through reading Scripture which the Second Vatican Council calls Scripture food for the soul. The Church has always venerated divine Scripture just as she venerates the body of the Lord and states that the bread of life are both from the table of God’s word and of Christ’s body.” (Dei Verbum No. 21).

We can also encounter the Lord through all the different ways to pray and St. John Paul II noted that praying the holy rosary puts us “in living communion with Jesus” (Rosarium Virginis Mariae).

Feeling lonely or afraid? Enjoy a spiritual communion. Pray Jesus’ last words before His ascension, “**I am with you always...**” Matthew 28:20 DeColores!

Spiritual communion brings peace because peace begins when Jesus is in us.

“My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the most Blessed Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there, and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you.

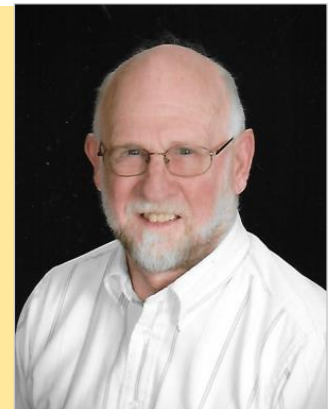
Lay Director, Webster Ultreya

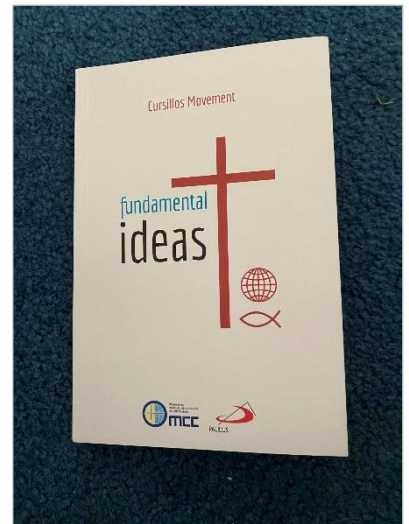
Cursillo National Encounter!

In 2019, I, along with many others from the Rochester School of Leaders, attended the Cursillo National Encounter in Scranton, Pennsylvania. The Encounter was a profound experience that I will never forget. Hundreds of Cursillistas; lay persons, religious, deacons, priests and bishops gathered together joyfully and lovingly—a love that was instantaneous! Christ was everywhere—in everyone! Just as the Holy Spirit breathed on the apostles in the Upper Room and gave the command to go and make disciples of all nations, the Holy Spirit's presence was unmistakable in the gathering of the Cursillistas at the National Encounter. These Cursillistas were likewise being “called to make their life Christian and become apostles who would transform their environments.” (Fundamental Ideas p.29:13e.)

Cursillistas listened intently as Miguel Sureda and Ramos Rossello from Majorca, Spain, reflected first hand on the life of Eduardo Bonnin as they knew him, his vision and the mentality of Cursillo. At the Encounter, The Step by Step Rectors Guide and the 3 day Rollos, given to Eduardo Bonnin by the Holy Spirit, were given to all of the Schools of Leaders in the US to ensure that the content of our Cursillo is simple, clear and contains all that is necessary, nothing more, nothing less, in order to make sure that our Cursillo is authentic.

Along this incredible journey, among many other resources, I found the book Fundamental Ideas to be a wonderful resource in understanding the worldwide Cursillo Movement as it leads me and my fellow Cursillistas on our path to personal holiness incorporating the joy of the Gospel, the joy of Cursillo! 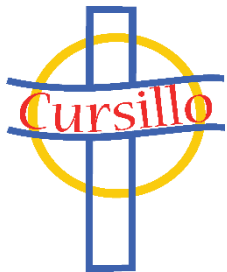

Who is Eduardo Bonnin and why is he up for Sainthood?

I got my first glimpse of our Founder, Eduardo Bonnin Aguilo, at the III World Ultreya in Rome in 2000. A small, humble man with a gentle smile, whose simple message was, “God in Christ loves you!” Born in 1917, in Palma, Mallorca, Eduardo lived a happy childhood and was educated in Catholic schools. As a young adult, during his compulsory military service, Eduardo came into direct contact with the profane and immoral. He was forced to confront Christian principles and their effect on the environment. This analysis was the origin of the Study of the Environment rollo. It was also a plan to bring Christian values to normal life. From the tripod of his life: Christ, Persons and Friendship, grew the Cursillo tripod: Piety, Study and Apostolic Action. Eduardo, empowered by the Holy Spirit, gave the world a movement for the laity, to work in tandem with Christ to change their own “square meter” of the world. Eduardo said, “the mind is a gospel; the heart, a tabernacle and the arms, a lever to lift the world to God.” He was concerned with the “far away” and never stopped participating in Cursillo activities even attending in his wheelchair. Eduardo died February 6, 2008. On his tomb reads, “An Apprentice Christian.” The message of Cursillo continues to resonate around the world by those whose lives have been changed through prayer and the work of the Holy Spirit. Eduardo's cause for beatification began in 2015 by the Foundation Eduardo Bonnin Aguilo (FEBA.) This Foundation preserves the life and history of Eduardo, to preserve the foundational Charism and support the canonization process. Eduardo dedicated his whole life to total surrender to Christ, to the Person, and to Friendship through the Cursillo Movement. His life was committed to making friends and making them friends of Christ, in the way of normality. Over ten million people have discovered the love of God through the experience lived in Cursillo from its inception in 1944 to the present. Eduardo will be the Saint of Normality! Fast forward 45 years....I became one of those "crazy angels" many, many times.

In May of this year, I became very ill. In my Old Italian worry mode, I thought I had the Coronavirus. My doctor sent me to the E.R. for testing and a workup. In short, I had a severe stomach flu and a UTI, I was released with the stipulation that I not be alone. My kids were great and took turns staying for a week. Meanwhile, word had gotten the the Cursillo community and friends. I know God was flooded with prayers and my thanks to all.

The first day on my own, on May 16th, was a bummer, because I had to make my own breakfast! While making breakfast, I received a cell phone call from George Welch. He asked how I was doing and I said I was doing much better. He then asked me to look out my front window and I did. There standing in the road was George and his wife Paula. I opened the door and went out on the porch to be serenaded with Las Maninitas. I am sure my neighbors wondered what this is all about? When I am able, I will tell them that this is Christ in Action. Thank you so much to my crazy friends, Paula and George. It was a beautiful morning. DeColores!
