Spiritual Advisor Wisdom

Prayer of Goodness and Kindness

How do I pray with pain? Can I pray when I or others are suffering? As a hospital chaplain I frequently was with patients and families who are not able to respond because of sickness, grief, fear or pain. Being with people who are in spiritual pain often calls for silence. Silence allows the Holy to be there. Silence invites us to go to our hearts and to be. We may feel that we must do something. Can you say a prayer chaplain? I have a question that you might be able to answer. Why is my mom hurting so much? Where is God?

During these times I have used a prayer practice that I learned from Bill Smith a hospice chaplain. You breathe in the pain and hurt of the person who is sick. Be present to the person. You then breathe out peace sending a healing Spirit to them. You do this in silence. You are with them and send goodness to them. St. Therese called it a "little way", doing little things with great love. You build a circle of silent love around them.

My wife Paula read a story about a prayer of goodness and kindness in her Quilting magazine. The story was about a woman who prayed while she quilted for those whom she loved and cared about. She simply sent out thoughts of goodness and kindness to the people. First you picture yourself in a circle of love. Give yourself goodness and kindness. You then bring into the circle those whom you love and you send to them love and kindness. Picture them with the arms of Jesus around them. Take them into your heart. Next you take someone neutral and put them into the circle. Send the message of love and kindness. This may be someone you work with or an acquaintance like the telephone operator or a volunteer. Next you bring into the circle someone you need to forgive. Send them messages of love and kindness. The prayer transforms you and the person you are sending love and kindness to. Finally, you bring everyone into the circle, and you send them messages of love and kindness. St. John of Cross said, "cast your cares upon God, for you are his and he will not forget you."

In the Christian tradition we believe in the communion of saints and the interconnectedness of the people of God. The specific teaching is that we are created in the image and likeness of God and that God is in love with us. We all have a basic core of goodness because God created us. Nothing can ever change this. Paul invites us to turn this into action by following what he calls the Excellent Path. He outlines it in 1Corinthians 13. As a Christian Contemplative I accept the presence and action of a God of love in what I do and how I pray. Each day as I sit in prayer I open my heart to God. As Fr. Thomas Keating repeats frequently I consent to the presence and action of God. The God that I open to is my "Abba" my loving parent. God calls us to be in a relationship where prayer and action come together.

Everything that is done in terms of the Cursillo purpose and practice has the Postcursillo as its final objective. The Precursillo and the Cursillo are only initial steps toward the Postcursillo. Like everything else in life, it involves a process.

- Precursillo – the person seeks Christ
- 3-Day Cursillo – the person encounters Christ
- Postcursillo – the person follows Christ; the perennial living of what is fundamental for being Christian.

There are two purposes of the Cursillo Movement: Immediate and Ultimate
The immediate purpose provides the foundation to live what is fundamental for being a Christian – love of God and neighbor, experienced through the encounter with oneself, with Christ and with others. The ultimate purpose is to support Christianity in society, with those who live as a Christian, loving God and our neighbor, throughout our daily lives following these encounters.

We need to remind ourselves that while the Group Reunion and the Ultreyas are essential to the Cursillo, they are not ends in themselves. They must serve as a means for cursillistas to be holy. The Group Reunion and the Ultreyas are the formation for the cursillistas to use as they deal with their daily lives..

Book Review: *Diary of an American Exorcist*


Friends, do you agree that we have been on a rollercoaster ride these last couple of years? If so, you have been turning to prayers to help you and your loved ones. My prayers during this turbulent time have been for perseverance and an increase in my faith, hope and charity. I pray for people I disagree with; "Bless him/her and change me." I pray for our country to turn back to God and be at peace. Sadly, I note that people are violent, church attendance is down, nuclear families and family values are in question, and society expects us to be tolerant, accept everything, and allow free will. Friends, something diabolical is very present in our society today.

Therefore, I cannot say enough about the *Diary of an American Exorcist*. I found this book informative, inspiring, and beneficial. I will turn back to it repeatedly. Arguably lay people do not know or understand many things about the demonic. Msgr. Rossetti offers us an inside look at his exorcist vocation. He shares his encounters with the demonic during exorcism as well as in his daily life. It is amazing how easily demons may harass, much less possess people. We are assured that the demonic are no match for the Chief Exorcist Jesus Christ, Our Lady Mary, St Joseph, the Choirs of Angels, and the interceding saints.

That said, Msgr. Rossetti is concerned that America needs deliverance. The USA, he notes, has symptoms of being demonically oppressed and having a demonic mentality. Demonic oppression is evident in the drop in faith and church attendance, one million abortions a year, the practice of witchcraft and occult practices, drug abuse, and pornography. These practices open doors for the demonic. A "demonic mentality" is evident by the discord in our society. This discord precedes suicides, unhappiness, loneliness, rage, anger, murder, and terrorism.

We receive insights into what we need to do and not do in this book. Msgr. Rossetti encourages us to trust in our loving merciful God, hold on to Jesus, say our daily rosary, and ask Our Blessed Mother Mary, St Joseph, the angels, and the saints to protect us. I encourage you to read this book so you too can learn about the role of the exorcist priest and the receive support, strength, and comfort in the healing power of God.

What is REC?

Several Cursillistas have heard people talk about doing REC and I thought I would explain it. REC (Residents Encounter Christ) is a retreat program done inside prisons and jails around the United States and other places. It has its roots in Cursillo and the Teens Encounter Christ movement. A funny story about how REC got canceled at one of the prisons: The administration canceled this "REC" at a prison because they thought it was a 3 day recreation program put on by volunteers and that is just not acceptable for the incarcerated. The prison chaplain had to explain that it is a religious experience with the mission to create an environment where the incarcerated can come to know the peace of Christ and live more fully as Christians during and after their incarceration.

In the 1970's, three Cursillistas from the Rochester area attended a REC program at a downstate prison and were so impressed that they started a REC at the Auburn Correctional Facility. And now its offered at Attica, Wende, Groveland and Auburn facilities. Way to go: Bob Bacher, Sandy Sinopoli and Stan Zawacki!!! REC is very similar to the structure of Cursillo by having talks by lay people and then table discussions which help the men form Christian support communities to encourage them after the volunteers leave. There are some similar talks like: Ideals, Piety and Christian Life and Community in Action.

Many of the residents have life changing experiences and truly experience the love and forgiveness of Our Lord and Savior and others for the first time. One resident shared that he knows he is in prison because he deserved to be but he finally had the chance to feel like a real person because of REC. Others have shared they have not had visitors and they truly enjoyed seeing and sharing with people from the outside, talking about the Bills, foods they miss, their families, etc. Many of us like my husband Tom and I who do RECs get much more than we give!!! Unfortunately, because of Covid all programs in New York state have been suspended for last 18 months. Would you please pray that the Lord will open up this wonderful grace filled opportunity to the prison population again so we can follow the Lord's command of Matthew 25:36, 'I was... in prison and you visited me.'

Here is how the prayer comes together as one that is grounded in the belief that the Spirit dwells in everyone. Yes, that is everyone. The kingdom of God is with the hurting, disenfranchised, sinful, broken humanity. As I bring into consciousness those who suffer or those who are afraid, I pray. "The arms of the Crucified are spread out to draw you to his heart." (St. Teresa Benedicta)

1. Go to a quiet place of interior silence and pray a short prayer such as psalm 43. "Be still and know that I am God. Or Isaiah 43:4 "Because you are precious in my eyes and glorious and because I love you." Sink into the realization that God is in love with this person and you. You are alert and open to the presence of God.
2. Call into mind a person who you wish to love, send goodness and kindness. Picture them as God's child and whole. Send a message of love and grace to them as members of the mystical Body.
3. Breathe in the love of God for you and the person you are praying for. Breathe out, send the basic core of goodness to that person or situation. Think positive thoughts. Send out that healing spirit. We are in the Divine dance. God is in relationship with us, we are forgiven and healed.
4. Close by breathing you are accepting love. Breathe out the goodness and kindness of the psalmist. "Only goodness and kindness will follow me all the days of my life." (Ps 23) We build a circle of Love.




